
## Secretary of the Faculty: Joseph S. Ferrell

Joseph Stevens Ferrell is Research Professor of Public Law and Albert Coates Professor of Public Law Emeritus in the School of Government. He has served as secretary of the faculty since July 1, 1996. Ferrell received his undergraduate and law degrees from Carolina and a master of laws degree from Yale. He joined the Carolina faculty on June 1, 1964.

Ferrell's scholarly interests center on local government law, the legal aspects of public finance and local taxation, the legislative institution and parliamentary procedure, and the origins and development of the North Carolina Constitution. His publications include *County Government in North Carolina* (1st edition); *The General Assembly of North Carolina: A Handbook for Legislators*; *Suggested Rules of Procedure for County Boards of Commissioners*; and numerous journal articles, book chapters,



and monographs. He is a member of Phi Beta Kappa, the Order of the Coif, and the Order of the Golden Fleece. He is a recipient of the C. Knox Massey Award, the Thomas Jefferson Award, the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners' Distinguished Service Award, and the General Alumni Association's Faculty Service Award. In his capacity as secretary of the faculty, Ferrell is a member of the Faculty Council, the Faculty Executive Committee, the Faculty Nominating Committee, the Committee on University Government, the Chancellor's Advisory Committee, the Committee on Honorary Degrees and Special Awards, the Commencement Committee, the Commencement Speaker Selection Committee, and the University Day Committee.
